My Parachute Jump Experience

On Friday 29th June 2018 Devon in Sight's Chief Executive Grahame Flynn and former Community Support Worker Margaret Vickers jumped out of an aircraft at 15,000 feet to raise funds for the charity. Grahame recounts the experience.

"Despite a morbid fear of heights I was strangely excited at the prospect of doing a parachute jump. Our hosts were the Skydive Buzz Team based at Dunkeswell Airfield near Honiton. The pre-jump briefing was comprehensive and gave us a degree of confidence. We were trained to assume three positions; exiting the aircraft, free-fall and landing.

After sitting around for a couple of hours we donned our rather fetching yellow jump suits. The plane rapidly ascended

to 15,000 feet which is the highest jump you can do without an oxygen supply.

Margaret was sitting to my right, and nervously said, "You are going first aren't you?"
Before I could say anything Marg was told that she was going first. Within seconds I saw her exit the plane and two seconds later disappear from sight.

"Hell's bells!" I thought and sheer terror set in. I was strangely lost for words!
Seconds later I was in free fall. There was a loud sound of wind rushing past me but no sensation of falling.
Holding out my arms I assumed the Superman position and started spinning.

Oh, this is actually fun!

A minute later the parachute was deployed and after a couple of seconds of rapid deceleration...silence.

Floating high above the Devonshire countryside I could see as far as the Severn Bridges, over Dartmoor, the coast at Sidmouth and up the Exe Estuary. A magical view.

The landing was gentle but I was very happy to be back on the ground. I have to say that the experience was quite exhilarating. I don't think I stopped smiling for the rest of the day.

The experience was so amazing that I was the first to sign up to our Jump for Sight Challenge in 2021."

What will happen on the day?

"A few words of encouragement will come from your instructor and you're off!!"

It's natural to feel nervous but you are in safe hands.

Here's what will happen on the day.

- A comprehensive Training Session where you will meet your instructor who will prepare you for your tandem skydive.
- Climb onboard the aircraft, where your instructor will tighten your harness as you ride up 15,000ft.
- Once at altitude, the door will open; you will feel a rush of air & noise as you edge towards the door.
- A few words of encouragement will come from your instructor and you're off!!
- You will experience speeds of an adrenaline pumping 120mph while freefalling up to two miles!
- · As the large canopy unfolds, you will become aware of the sudden peace, quiet and tranquillity.
- You may even be able to help your Instructor steer the parachute around the sky before gliding back to the airfield.
- Following a soft landing you will not be able to stop smiling for 24 hours!



Family and Friends

Family and friends are more than welcome to watch your unforgettable experience but please let them know that as a spectator there can be some waiting time. Please also make them aware that dogs are not allowed on the airfield.


For a small fee spectators can take a bus to the drop zone and witness your landing.

Booking Your Jump



You can book your Skydive online or on the telephone.

Booking Your Jump Online

- 1. Go to the Skydive Buzz website. www.skydiveukltd.com/charity-profile/?charity=798
- 2. Click on Events Planned Saturday 6th July 2024.
- 3. Click on any time available and then add Jumper.
- 4. Complete the details and select add jumper and complete Jump for Free and select Devon in Sight under Jumping for Charity
- 5. Read the terms and condition and tick that you have read them and confirm that you are over the age of 16.
- 6. Complete 'where did you hear about us'.
- 7. Click pay now £50.00 (Deposit) and complete the booking.
- 8. Click next again and decide whether you would like photographs or Video taken of your jump. This may seem expensive but it is a fabulous momento of the day!

If you prefer, you can call Skydive Buzz directly on **01404 890 222** and they can complete the booking for you.

Terms and Conditions

If you raise £395.00 you can jump for FREE. Please see the Jump for Free Scheme on the website.

If you are 15 stone/95kg fully clothed or over, there is a charge of £20.00 per additional stone.

All jumpers are covered by the British Skydiving third party Liability insurance and this has a cost of £22.42 which is not included in the package.

Creating your Fundraising Page



We recommend hosting your fundraising page for your event with JustGiving, the worlds leading fundraising platform.

Visit: www.justgiving.com

Log In or Sign Up:

If you already have an account, log in. If not, you'll need to sign up for a new account. You can sign up using your email address or connect with your Facebook account.

Create a Fundraising Page:

Once logged in, select the "Start Fundraising" or "Start a Fundraiser" button on the homepage.

Select Your Charity:

Select Devon in Sight.

Set a Fundraising Goal:

Set your fundraising target. This is the amount of money you hope to raise for Devon in Sight.

Personalise Your Page:

Customise your fundraising page with a title, description, and images. Explain why you are fundraising and why the cause is important to you. The more personal and compelling your page, the more likely people will donate.

Choose a Web Address (URL) for Your Page:

Create a unique and memorable web address for your fundraising page. This will be the link you share with others to direct them to your page.

Useful Tips

Make it personal

Explaining why you're doing this and how much it means to you will allow people to relate to what you're doing.

Thank you

With online fundraising pages it allows you to add a personal thank you message. This will then be sent to people when they donate.

Add a Profile Picture:

Upload a profile picture so people can see who you are. It adds a personal touch to your fundraising efforts.

Set a target

Having a target to aim for helps you keep track of your progress, but also shows other people how well you're doing too.

Sharing's caring

Don't be afraid to email the link to your page to all those in your contact list.

When you're fundraising, more is definitely merrier.

Get Social

Social media is your best friend. Share the link to your fundraising page on your social media page get people sharing it for you too.
Signature Block
Add a link to your page in email signature block, it's all good exposure.

Cash and Cheques

If people give you cash and cheques you can add them on your fundraising page as 'offline donations' so you can watch your total grow!

The event isn't the end

When you've completed your fundraiser, it shouldn't end there. Share your successful story and achievements online, and encourage those who didn't get chance to donate to top up your total.

Your Social Media Campaign



Social Media (for example, Facebook, X or Instagram) can be a great way to share your story and your fundraising page.

Most people tell us they find sharing their stories on Facebook, with people they know fairly well, works better for them than sharing on a social media channel where they don't know their followers as well. You can test this out to see what works best for you!

Before you share your page more widely, ask a few people close to you to sponsor you first to get things started. If you can, ask people you think might be quite generous, as this encourages others to be generous too!

Tip 1: Create urgency

When you post about your fundraising on social media try to give people a reason to sponsor you there-and-then, rather than holding back till later.

Tip 2: Create momentum

Post every few days or every week or so to keep reminding people and to create a buzz and sense of momentum around your fundraising campaign.

Tip 3: Create hooks

You can create 'hooks' or reasons to give updates or to base a fundraising ask around, for example, using your fundraising targets or just to say thank you.

Get Going!

Here are some ideas to put these tips into practice:

For your first post, tell people what you're doing and let them know you'd be really grateful for a few donations to get you off to a flying start.

Post every so often asking people to help you get to the next fundraising milestone, e.g. "Thanks everyone for helping me reach £160!
Can anyone help me get to £200? [link to your page here]". You could do this every few weeks or so, when you're approaching a new milestone.

Thank people publicly for their donation to keep drawing attention to what you are doing and to create positivity around your fundraising, e.g. "Big thanks to Jen, Claire and David for their donations - I'm now at £200! Thanks everyone for your support. It means a lot".

You could do this every week or so, depending on how often you get donations.

Regularly thank people who are supporting you with posts like - "Thank you so much for your support if anyone else is able to sponsor me l'd be really grateful [link to your page here]".

Pay day or towards the end of the month is a good time to ask for donations.

If you feel like it, you can just be completely blatant about this with something like "Since it's pay day... can anyone spare a pound or two to support my skydive?

Your Social Media Campaign



Keep your news updated with each fundraising milestone.

"Thanks to everyone who has helped me to raise £400 so far. I'd be super grateful if you could help me get to £500 [link to your page here] :)".

Reminders in the run up to your skydive, e.g. "I can't believe I'll be skydiving from 15,000ft this time next week.

Thanks to everyone who has helped me raise £600 so far.

If anyone else can help I'd be really grateful for whatever you can spare [link to your page here]".

Reminders of your story/ why you're doing this, e.g. "A week today is the big day. I'll be skydiving 15,000ft as part of Devon in Sight's Jump for Sight Challenge 2021. Here's a reminder of why I'm doing this [link to page here]". I would be so grateful for any support you can give. Day before, e.g. "Tomorrow is the big day. I'm really nervous! Thank you so much to everyone who has helped me raise £700. I'd be really grateful for any last minute donations [link to your page here]".

Don't forget to share images and your story on the day of your jump and invite people to make a donation.

You will be surprised how many people will make a donation after you have completed such a mind blowing feat!

with Sight Loss Exhibition.


